REHABILITATION

A Tireless Effort to Save Lives:

In our hectic, very mobile world, raptors face many challenges. From collisions with vehicles and human infrastructure (the #1 reason for admission) to habitat loss due to human population growth, more damaging weather patterns, and the spread of avian diseases, these magnificent birds often find themselves in dangerous situations. RMRP, and thus you, are there for them when they need us most.

We are committed to providing unparalleled care to every raptor that crosses our path. With a team of dedicated professionals, volunteers, interns, and accomplished veterinarians from Colorado State University's Avian, Exotic, and Zoological Medicine Service, each raptor benefits from decades of raptor medical experience.

As we continue our work of healing fallen raptors, we are reminded of the importance of our collective responsibility to protect and conserve these remarkable creatures and the environment that they (and we) call home.

2023 Rehabilitation Statistics

69% of treatable raptors were released.

53 DAYS: Average length of stay of a rehabilitating raptor.

10,340 DAYS: The total number of rehabilitation bird care days in 2023. What is a bird care day? Every day a raptor is in our care, it counts as one bird care day.

Top 4 Most Common Causes of Injury:

Almost 90% of the raptors in our care experience one of the following issues:

- General trauma or fractures
- Disease
- Vehicular collisions
- Starvation

Other reasons for admission include: Immature/baby raptors falling from destroyed nests, entanglement in barbed wire, netting, baling twine or fishing line, window strikes, electrocution or electric shock, water immersion, lead poisoning or toxicity, gunshots, oil spills, and exposure to toxins.

We monitored raptor diseases in 2023:

86 raptors tested positive for West Nile Virus (WNV).
30 raptors tested positive for Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza (HPAI).

Both are challenging diseases to treat, and HPAI is almost **100% fatal** in raptors. When HPAI patients are in our facility, they must be treated with strict biosecurity concerns in mind to ensure other raptors in our care do not also catch the disease.

We are one of the few facilities in the US where an HPAI-positive raptor has recovered and returned to the wild.

RESEARCH

Knowledge for the Future

Raptors in the wild are at risk due to habitat loss and human interference. We conduct research to help us better understand how to protect them and their habitats, as well as monitor disease transmission. Our research also informs decisions that make the world safer for them. Investing in raptor research is crucial for their survival and the health of raptors and our ecosystems.

2023 Research Projects

- West Nile Virus surveillance in raptors (RMRP, CSU Ebel, Bosco-Lauth)
- Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza testing and detection in local raptor populations (RMRP)
- Diversity of Leucocytozoon (a blood parasite) (Collins, Rhodes University, Memphis TN)
- Osprey Parasite Study focusing on trematode parasite infections, particularly flukes (parasitic flatworms) within the genus Scaphanocephalus, which are osprey specialists and travel with the birds during migration (Johnson Lab, University of CO)
- PacifiCorp Wind Project (PacifiCorp, USGS, RMRP) PacifiCorp will study bird safety near wind turbines and evaluate the effects of painting one wind turbine blade black to reduce risks to birds flying near wind projects. Before the study, PacifiCorp must understand the impact of scavengers on any carcass removal below the wind turbines so bird casualty counts are as accurate as possible. Carcasses from the RMRP are being sent to the wind turbine site in WY to help with this preliminary scavenger study.
- Wing measurements to determine dimensions of utility poles to prevent electrocution (RMRP)
- Ectoparasite (a parasite that lives on the outside of its host) collection (CSU Museum of Arthropod Diversity)
- Survey of lead levels in raptors of Northern Colorado and Wyoming (RMRP)
- Raptor carcasses collected for the Denver Museum of Nature and Science will become part of their tissue bank for education and research.

Our Sponsorship Partners in Research:

- Greg Ebel and Angela Bosco-Lauth provide West Nile Virus testing services through their respective labs.
- PacifiCorp provided an anesthesia machine for research and rehabilitation purposes and has helped support the costs associated with HPAI testing.
